

Breastfeeding: Practice & Policy Certificate Course

Our annual masters-level infant feeding course is the only advanced-level international training course on breastfeeding and related topics available worldwide.

What does it offer?

- A chance to update your scientific, technical and practical knowledge and skills for supporting best practices in infant feeding.
- Covers all aspects of breastfeeding, from birth to two years+.
- Includes policy and programme implementation.
- A unique opportunity to study evidence based breastfeeding with interested colleagues from around the world.
- Continually updated.
- Access to recognised experts in infant feeding.
- Emphasis on equipping professionals with skills and knowledge to use in their employment.
- Friendly and relaxed learning environment, where you can contribute and learn from each others experiences.
- Intensive course with a high level of contact time between participants and Course Directors.

Course Aims

To develop participants' capacity for taking an active role in protecting, promoting and facilitating optimal infant feeding practices, wherever they work.

Who should attend?

If infant feeding is an important part of your work, particularly if you coordinate national or local programmes, train others or need to have the answers to infant feeding issues – the course is intended for you.

Typically participants include paediatricians, midwifery lecturers, breastfeeding coordinators and public health specialists.

Teams from the same country or facility find attending the course together particularly rewarding.

The course takes an international perspective, following the WHO/UNICEF Global Strategy on Infant and Young Child Feeding and is suitable for participants from all types of economise.

The course is limited to 30 participants and is conducted in English.

Revised in 2008 to fit a **three-week** timetable, the course is in two parts which can be taken together (recommended) or separately.

18th Breastfeeding: Practice and Policy Course 8th - 26th June 2009

Part 1: Clinical Management and Public Health

2 weeks: 8th-19th June:

A comprehensive in-depth study programme examining the evidence for best practice recommendations and the skills required to support their realization in practice. Topics covered include anatomy and physiology of lactation, composition of breastmilk and infant formula, immunology, influences of birth practices, nutrition, breast conditions, counseling skills, problem solving and more.

Participants make visits to hospital, community or clinics and conduct case-study work with mothers and babies in the classroom.

Part 2:

Addressing Challenges to Optimal Practice and Implementation

1 week*: 22nd-26th June:

A series of themed study days investigating specific areas of infant and young child feeding (IYCF) in detail. Provisional topics:

- Planning and Implementing IYCF Programmes
- The Special Care Baby
- Infant Feeding and Emergencies
- Complementary feeding
- International Code of Marketing of Breastmilk Substitutes
