17th Breastfeeding: Practice & Policy Certificate Course

This popular annual infant feeding course has been substantially **REVISED**. It is the only advanced-level international training course on breastfeeding and related topics available worldwide, and continues to provide a unique study opportunity.

The revised **three**-week masters-level certificate course provides an up-to-date scientific, technical and practical training. It covers all aspects of breastfeeding, from birth to two years and beyond, including policy and programme implementation.

It is an intensive course with a high level of contact time between participants and Course Directors, and an emphasis on equipping professionals with skills and knowledge to use in their employment.

Course Aims

To develop participants' capacity to take an active role in protecting, promoting and facilitating optimal infant feeding practices, wherever they work.

Who should apply?

Doctors and other health or allied professionals involved in national or local infant feeding programmes. Teams from the same country or facility are particularly welcome.

The course takes an international perspective and is relevant for participants from all types of economies.

The course is limited to 30 participants and is conducted in English.

The full three week Certificate course is in two parts, which can be taken together (recommended) or separately.

Part 1: Clinical Management and Public Health

2 weeks 9th-20th June:

Part 1 provides a comprehensive in-depth study of breastfeeding. It includes:

- Why breastfeeding is important to the mother and baby
 - Anatomy and physiology of lactation and milk supply
 - Immunology
 - Breast conditions
 - The affects of labour and delivery practices
 - The special care baby
 - Maintaining exclusive breastfeeding
 - Practical skills such as optimal attachment and positioning, breastmilk expression
 - Counseling skills and problem solving
- and many more topics.

Visits to hospitals, community or clinic visits and meeting mothers and babies in the classroom.

With participants coming from many different countries experience sharing is an important part of the course. This creates a deeper understanding of the many and varied cultural issues influencing infant feeding and provides a valuable international perspective.

Part 2: Addressing Challenges to Optimal Practice and Implementation

1 week: 23rd – 27th June

Part 2 provides a series of themed study days on infant and young child feeding, covering:

- Programme planning and implementation of the main UNICEF and WHO global initiatives such as the Baby Friendly Hospital Initiative, the Global Strategy and the International Code of Marketing of Breastmilk Substitutes;
- Complementary feeding
- Infant Feeding and Emergencies
- HIV
